## Membership renewals, Ticket information

**Our esteemed Ticket Tout, Nick has kindly put together the following on bus bookings, ticket deadlines, methods of pay et al. This was e-mailed out a few weeks ago so some of you may have seen this before. If not, please take a minute to read through it, as it could result in you owing the Club money, which AK will gladly hunt you down for.**

The spreadsheet overleaf clarifies for season ticket holders that apply with the club for tickets, the procedures regarding bus booking and home cup games for next season.

### **Bus Booking (BUS)**

If next to your name it says:

**YES** – You are booked on the bus for every home game, if you can't make it, you must cancel by previous Tuesday for a weekend game or by previous Saturday for a midweek game. If you fail to show up, you will have to pay a fine of £8.

**NO** – You must phone, text or email me to book a seat following the deadlines above.

### **Home Cup Matches (CUP)**

If next to your name it says:

**CLUB** – For CIS and Scottish Cup matches, you will be asked via text or e-mail if you want a ticket for that particular game.

**DD** – You are receiving your tickets by direct debit or are responsible for getting your own home cup tickets

### **Champions League Home Tickets.**

All season ticket holders must apply themselves for their Champions League Packages by completing the form which will be sent by Celtic. The only exceptions are those that appear in bold on the spreadsheet as they do not hold a season book in their own name. These will be applied for by the club on their behalf.

### **Domestic Away Games**

Celtic no longer accepts supporters club applications. HWEUCSC has 24 people

applying for a total of 111 tickets for every game. Offer letters are sent by Celtic to these people who hand the tickets into the club to distribute. There is always extremely high demand for Aberdeen, Inverness, Hearts, Rangers and Falkirk, so will be less tickets available for these games due to low allocations.

### **European Away Games**

Celtic does not accept supporters club applications. This is done purely on an individual basis as you will have seen on season book renewal form. If you are allocated a ticket for an away game in Europe by the ticket office, please accept it even if you can't go as I will buy it for the club and it increases your chances of being offered again in the future for a game you can go to.

### **Deadlines**

The deadline for all matches next season is 2 weeks in advance. If you cancel less than 5 days before you will be liable for the cost of the ticket if it can't be sold. Celtic has a 24 Hour home ticket line – 0870 060 1888. If you don't have a season ticket I would strongly advise that you join the Celtic One club at a cost of £32 which is available on the number given. All members of this get priority for home games, games such as Hearts last season did not even go to public sale, I would expect this to be the same next season especially with Champions League.

If you want to change the way you are categorised for bus seats or home cup matches or wish to be added to the clubs list or have any queries, please let me know by 26 July by phone or email.
